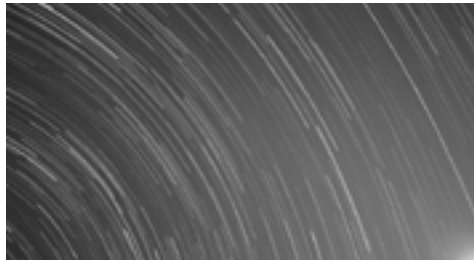

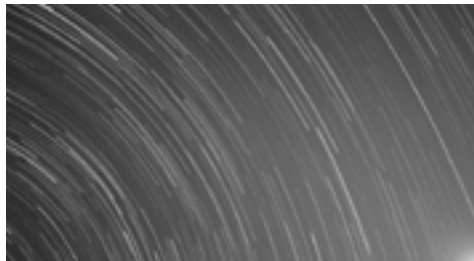

Undocumented Youth Organize Inside Broward Detention Center!

Since June 17, 2011, the Obama Administration has insisted that it has been using discretion in deportation cases which can be considered "low-priority," or cause undue hardship for citizen family members. In June of this year, Obama announced extending deferred action to undocumented youth after NIYA occupied his campaign offices for two weeks, costing his campaign thousands of hours of staff time. To date only 1.9% of such cases have actually been dropped.

Several NIYA members, including Viridiana Martinez, a member of the NC Dream Team, infiltrated the Broward Detention

Center. They put themselves through deportation proceedings in order to be able to enter the Center, to gather information about what is actually happening in the center.

Inside Broward, the organizers found:

- People inside who have pending application for a U Visa;
- More than a dozen DREAM Act eligible youth;
- Over 60 individuals with no criminal record or prior deportations, some detained as passengers in vehicles;
- More than 3-dozen cases in which individuals are still eligible for discretion despite previous contacts with the system;
- Several cases of immigrants in need of immediate medical care, including one individual with a blood clot in his leg and another with a bullet in the spine.
