OG Whole wheat bread flour (55%), Water (36%), Non-GMO canola Oil (3%), NC Honey (3%), NC sorghum



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OG Whole wheat bread flour (55%), Water (36%), Non-GMO canola Oil (3%), NC Honey (3%), NC sorghum (1%), Salt, Yeast.

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White Sandwich Bread

OG white bread flour (63%), Water (35%), Salt, Yeast.

Olive Rosemary Bread

OG white bread flour (39%), (Water (35%), OG ww bread flour (16%), Olives (5%), Olive oil (2%), Rosemary from Nadeen Bir's garden, OG garlic powder, salt.

Lemon-poppyseed muffins

Grated organic carrots (18%), Orange juice (13%), Organic whole-wheat pastry flour (13%), Organic all-purpose flour (13%), Canola oil (10%), Organic raisins (8%), Orange county honey (7%), NC pecans (6%), Water (5%), OG shredded coconut (4%), Brown sugar (2%), Baking powder, cinnamon, ginger, cardamom, baking soda, salt.

Granola

Organic Oats (60%), NC Honey (11%), Canola Oil (9%), OG Sunflower Seeds (7%), OG Pumpkin Seeds (5%), NC Pecans (5%), TN Sorghum Molasses (3%), Raisins, Salt, Cinnamon, Cardamom.

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How is Durham changing?

Statistics only tell part of a story, but they can be helpful for showing broad patterns. The most recent census data (from a telephone survey called the American Community Survey) showed that the population of Durham County as a whole increased by 44,273 people (just under 20%) between 2000 and 2010.

About 1/4 of that change came from people moving into Durham from elsewhere in NC. Slightly more than 1/4 came from those moving into Durham from elsewhere in the US, and about 1/20th came from people moving from other countries.

The median income of all folks who moved in was slightly lower than that of the county as a whole residents (even lower was folks who reported having

moved within the county in the past year). Folks whom the Census Bureau identified as non-Hispanic white, Asian or Pacific Islander, and American Indian were all more likely to have moved into Durham in the past year than folks who were identified as Black or Hispanic/Latino. I have a really hard time figuring out how to talk about Census data on race and ethnicity in a way which acknowledges the violence in how the Census Bureau counts people by forcing them into a limited number of identity boxes.

Today Durham County has many more people than it did in 2000. More families and a higher percentage of the population are living below the poverty line (85,441 people as compared to 62,667). Durham County's population is less white (now 46%, was 51%), slightly less Black (38% down from 39%), and significantly more people were identified as Hispanic/Latino (13% up from 7.6%).

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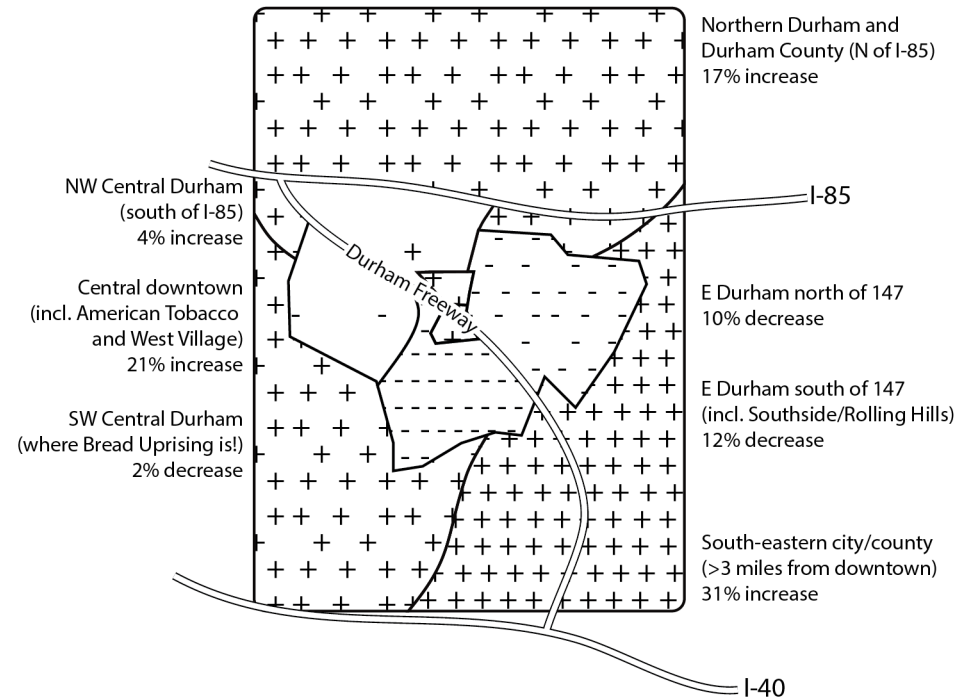
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
