The ninth Moral Monday was held last Monday, July 1, at the Legislative building in Raleigh. Led by the NAACP, the Monday assemblies are in protest of the actions of the North Carolina state legislature—which is led in both the House and the Senate by Republican supermajorities. Just this week, the NC General Assembly (what the legislature is called) has cut off unemployment benefits to 70,000 North Carolinians and shut down every abortion clinic in the state but one.

Here are reflections from **Heather Lee**, a dancer and a member of SpiritHouse Inc. in Durham. SpiritHouse is a non-profit grassroots organization that uses art and media to empower communities most affected by poverty, racism, gender

discrimination, and the school-to-prison pipeline (where youth of color are criminalized starting as children, and effectively shuttled towards prisons and jails).
